The Measuring Up Fund monies were utilized by the Committee to provide wheelchair accessible washroom facilities and a wheelchair ramp at the Lions Hall in New Hazelton and to replace a door at the Skeena Bakery (an initiative of the Skeena Supported Employment Society). The existing door and doorway present significant barriers to people with physical disabilities.

Both of these buildings are now accessible and will continue to be accessible. The goals of the Committee were fully met with no significant impediments along the way.
