The grant we received was put toward several projects that have been completed, namely:

- Two information luncheons held in November 2007, and held at Westview Pizza in Powell River. The first luncheon was geared to employment program directors and unions, while the second was an informational session with the City of Powell River Councilors and labour representative/ human resources department. Discussions held during these two luncheons have led to our current short-term goal of holding a Disabilities Employment/Career Fair to be held in the October 2008.
- The spoken-word radio program dealing with disability issues entitled "inclusion Today" for which we received funds to hire a part-time radio programmer/producer/host is on the air on CJMP 90.1 FM in Powell River on Thursdays from 1:00 to 1:30. The producer of this program underwent a training period that included research and development of radio programming, as well as basic computer skills. Her employment hours were augmented through employment programs, and is currently employed at 20 hours per week. The program is available online through

• The Powell River Business and Access Guide (with new online presence and Accessible Tourism/Map inserts) was published in hard-copy format as well as online (see: <a href="www.praccess.ca">www.praccess.ca</a>). As stipulated in our grant request, part of the grant monies went to being able to print the Guide and offer it free of charge to the public for the first time.

The grant received also allowed us to hire a very competent parttime accessibility evaluator to update the guide's information and access levels as well as producing new diagrams for accessibility in the home and workplace, including parking, washroom, doorway design, etc. The grant also permitted us to hire a part-time employee to research and complete an **Accessible Tourism** section for the new guide, and a **web** designer to create the new website (www.praccess.ca).

The grant received also has a promotional component to the guide, and this is currently underway, and will be completed upon reception of the remaining 10% of the grant awarded (\$2,000). Planned are various campaigns including free distribution to local businesses/ organizations, and a promotional launch at the Powell River Public Library including promotional bookmarks and cross-linking between local websites like the City of Powell River, the Chamber of Commerce, and many seniors' and disability-related organizations' websites. The grant we received was put to great use by producing actual projects that will continue to profile our Measuring Up efforts for years to come, through print and radio and the internet. This also allowed us to train and hire our radio producer, Annie, who also continues to be an enthusiastic volunteer at CJMP (Jump) Community Radio, operated by The Powell River Model Community Project (MCP). Through the MCP's Employment Program for Persons with Disabilities, and Service Canada, the MCP was able to increase her hours per week to 20. This has allowed Annie—who had no formal education or experience in media, and had only basic computer skills — to learn and produce her own program with the support of the Jump radio team. We are happy to announce that Annie's program Inclusion Today, is online as a freely available and downloadable podcast at:

As Inclusion Today's podcast web page description reads:

"[Inclusion Today] is a new spoken-word program focusing primarily on people with disabilities, and issues of access and inclusion: access to activities, services and opportunities that everyone should be able to benefit from in our society, with the dignity of being included in all aspects of daily life. Our mandate is to inform and create a dialog between the general public, businesses, governments, and various organizations that work with individuals with disabilities.

Inclusion Today is partially funded by 2010 Legacies Now's 'Measuring Up' Access & Inclusion Fund.

Annie has gained in confidence and is well on her way to becoming an expert interviewer/producer.

In addition, the newly updated and revamped **Powell River Business & Access Guide** will be out in its spiral-bound (for easier access) and free version by the end of May. 





# Powell River given accessibility money

A cheque for \$20,000 is on its way to Powell River's Model Community Project. It's part of a funding announcement made Tuesday, September 18 by 2010 Legacies Now.

2010 Legacies Now is a not-for-profit society committed to creating sustainable legacies as a result of hosting the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Geraldine Braak, president of the Powell River Model Community for Persons with Disabilities Society, and chairwoman of the Measuring Up Committee, said the funding will be used in three ways. "First, we will use it to help us get the message to city department managers, unions and schools about who we are and what we are doing," she said. "We want to encourage them to participate in improving and maintaining Powell River's

accessibility. We need all members of the community to appreciate the abilities of people with disabilities and give them a fair chance of employment."

The second focus for the funding will be radio interview programs. "Probably four half-hour programs," said Braak. "They'll be geared to different disabilities. Our idea is to let various organizations bring out the different aspects of what they do and the people they support."

The third target for the funding is the Powell River Access and Business Guide. "We are trying to do a two-year version and have it online as well," said Braak. "People coming into the city use the guide to find which businesses are accessible to the disabled."

Two million dollars was put aside to be distributed by 2010 Legacies Now to communities applying for funding for accessibility projects. A total of \$580,000 in grants was distributed to 30 BC communities in Tuesday's announcement. The amounts awarded were between \$15,000 and \$20,000, based on population.

The funds will be released immediately. There may be further funding for communities already awarded grants. The next round of applications will be accepted December 31. 2010 Legacies Now is hoping more communities will apply and focus on improving accessibility for disabled people in their part of the province.

"I know Powell River's committee will put this grant to good use and their efforts will go a long way," said Claude Richmond, BC's minister of employment and income assistance. "But

that doesn't mean there won't be money available for communities like Powell River if they apply again," he said. "It's too early to say that just yet. We will see how far we can make this \$2 million go."

Carla Qualtrough is the director of inclusion initiatives for 2010 Legacies Now.

"Definitely, Powell River is at the forefront of our community engagement," she said. "They've been with us from the start. And I mean demonstrating and doing, not just talking about it."

"This funding announcement is very encouraging," said Braak. Then she laughed. "Actually, they sent us \$37 more than we asked for. Our application was for \$19,963.00, and they're sending us \$20,000. I kind of chuckled."
